Teaching

I have taught at various art colleges, including Colchester, Maidstone, and Camberwell. I was Chair of the Education Working Group for Bankside Gallery, the gallery of the Royal Watercolour Society from 1999 – 2004. I was the organiser of “Drawn to the River”, a project sponsored by the Big Draw, October 2003 for Bankside Gallery, the finished collaborative artwork is displayed at Guys Hospital. Presently I run two small watercolour clubs in Dulwich, one of which is called the “Grange Lane Group,” who exhibit regularly at the Jeannie Avent Gallery, and the other group are “The Dulwich Woods Group”, who are exhibiting at the Camberwell Arts Festival 2018 and at the Jeannie Avent Gallery in October 2019. I also teach for the Royal Watercolour Society at their regular family event days and, previously, on residential courses.
